DEAR COMRADES AND FRIENDS:—

The last Circular in relation to the History of the 9th Regt. N. H. V., was issued Jan. 15th, 1896, by the sub-committee on publication, announcing the completion of the history, prices of same, when and how obtained, etc.

There has been no change in prices which are as follows:

CLOTH BOUND, \$3.00 PER COPY  
HALF MOROCCO, \$4.50 PER COPY  
LIBRARY, \$5.00 PER COPY

To all parties other than comrades of the Regiment, their widows or children the price of the cloth bound will be \$3.50; the half morocco and library bound the same as above.

Since the Rumford Printing Co. succeeded the Republican Press Association of Concord, N. H., who printed and bound the history and where the books were stored and on sale, the Rumford Printing Co. have shipped the whole publication to the Treasurer, C. W. Wilcox, 138 Main street, Milford, Mass., to whom all orders should be sent and under the same instructions as in our circular of 1896, viz: no copies will be delivered unless the money accompanies the order, except when ordered C. O. D. Parties sending through the mail should send P. O. order, registered letter or certified check; otherwise at their own risk. When the amount due is received, the history will be delivered by the U. S. mail, or express, prepaid. This is the only publication of the Regt. and there are not a large number of copies on hand, and as time goes on the descendants and friends of the brave boys of 1861 and 1865 who made this history possible, will prize it more and more. Many critics outside the members of the Regt. consider it one of the best regimental histories published. The history has more than 900 pages and contains a narrative of its service from its organization in 1862, until its final muster-out in 1865. More than 130 faces of old comrades, including the general officers in command of the Corps division and brigade, will be found looking out from its pages.

In the appendix is a complete description and roster of the 1876 men connected with the regiment during its service, as copied from the adjutant general's report.
