Sir

I have enlisted a number of our New Levies
to serve during War and borrowed money to pay them
the State bounty - many others appear willing
to engage and as I have no publick Money on
hand wish to be supplied by the State with Ten
or Fifteen Thousand dollars as soon as is convenient
for that purpose -

Cap^t Robinson who delivered me
a List of the Levies raised by the State for the present
year had not been able to ascertain the Time, ~~of~~ and
Term for which many of them engaged - I have invol-
ved their Names, requesting the matter may be in-
quired into and report made me, as tis a Matter
of some importance to them and the State -
