Gentlemen

Upon a representation from your board, that Mr. J. Quin late Surgeon of the Genl. Sullivan private Vessel of War, was detained at Wallfay; I was committed by the Council of this State, to close confinement.

Near two months since, Mr. Chubb an Officer of the Deane Frigate brought information, that Mr. Quin had made his escape; which was confirmed by the Master of a Vessel, captured and brought into Salem. - Application being made for my release, was answered that as no intelligence had been received from New Hampshire, the information could not sufficiently authorize it.

Much wish Gentlemen you will oblige me, by acquainting whether you have any knowledge of his escape or return.
