Some white on his back and Belly,
no artificial mark. Also, a Stray heifer
Coming in two years old of a Pale Red Colour
Some white on her Belly Leggs and tail

These are therefore to authorize & require
you to make a just and impartial Appraisal
of the abovementioned Steer & heifer
to be Shewn you by the said Josiah
Bachelier And make Return to me upon
Oath of the Value of said Steer & heifer
as soon as may be. Dated at Hampton falls
Decr 5th 1758 In the 32th year of his Majesty's Reign
