Governor Bradford and my
self were Order'd to come to
you with the Letters from
Governor Greene, but meeting Mr
Mumford on the Road he
informs us that we should not
be able to see ^{neither} the Assembly or
Council of your State, so have
now forwarded the papers by
Mr Mumford. We have obtained
a Draft of one Regiment to
March immediately from Massa-
chusetts, for the Relief of our
State, also Eighteen Hundred to
be sent within Twenty Days.

We must earnestly request you to
send on what is deficient of the
Three Hundred Men that you was
to furnish us with what addition
you may think necessary for your
proportion of the Connecticut Troops,
Our situation is truly pitiable and
except we are supported vigorously
by our Sister States we must be
soon swallowed up.
