In Congress 2^d Octob^r 1779

Whereas in the first resolution of Congress of the 24th of September last relative to a district of Country called New Hampshire Grants, is the following clause Viz "and also to authorize Congress to proceed to hear and determine all disputes subsisting between the Granters of the several States aforesaid with one another, or with either of the said States, respecting title to Lands lying in the said district, to be heard and determined in the mode prescribed for such cases by the articles of confederation aforesaid" and whereas no provision is made in the said articles of confederation for hearing and determining disputes between any State and the Granters of any other State

Resolved Unanimously, That the clause above recited be repealed

Resolved Unanimously, That it be and hereby is recommended to the States of New Hampshire, Massachusetts Bay, and New York to authorize Congress to proceed to hear and determine all disputes subsisting between

between the Grantees of the Several States
aforesaid with one another, or with either of
the said States, respecting title to Lands lying
in the said district, to be heard and deter-
mined by Commissioners or Judges "to be
appointed in the mode prescribed by the
ninth Article of the confederation aforesaid."

Ordered That a copy of the preceding
resolves be transmitted to the said States of
New Hampshire, Massachusetts Bay and New-
York and also to the inhabitants of the New-
Hampshire Grants.
