Boston Octo. 23. 1769 1474

This day at 12 Clock I Rec^d. your Letter
of 4th Instant by which you may Judge
it will be impossible for me to be present
at the Division of the Land but doubt not
it will be done as well without me, I shall
be willing to pay my part of the Charge
about six weeks since I was at ^{Salem} about
~~six weeks ago~~ and was there Inform^d. that the
greatest part of our Land was sold by the
Proprietors of Derry and irrecoverable, what
was left was but of very little Value.
I think the taking proper Care of the Eastern
Land is very necessary I would be glad you
were of my mind I am with proper Respect
to your Wife &c
