In Council of War

Providence June 13<sup>th</sup> 1778.

Honorable Gentlemen,

We inclose you a copy of a Letter from  
Governor Sumblid by which you will perceive that  
we have no longer any reasonable Expedition of further  
Assistance from that State than the 200 Men they have  
lent to the Massachusetts - Bay

The exposed Situation of this State the great  
Force of the Enemy at Rhode Island, and the almost  
total Neglect of our Sister States have greatly discouraged  
our Inhabitants - Unless we receive Assistance there is  
Danger of our being blotted out from the United States.

We have appointed His Honor the Deputy  
Governor and the Honorable William Bradford Esq<sup>r</sup>. to  
apply to you and the State of Massachusetts - Bay to  
supply your respective Stipulated Quotas of Men; and  
also to make good the Deficiency of Connecticut.

We are with great Esteem.
