The United States in Congress assembled.
May 26th 1791.

Ordered

That a copy of Major general Greene's letter of the 22^d of April last be transmitted to the executives of the States from New Hampshire to New Jersey both inclusive that the said States respectively may have before them as fully as the same is communicated to Congress the dangerous situation of the Southern States, and from a knowledge of their circumstances & consideration of their distress may be prompted to make the utmost exertions for sending forward to the main army their quotas of men agreeably to the requisitions of Congress of the 3^d & 21st day of October last, whereby alone the Commander in Chief can be enabled to give effectual succour to the Southern States and prosecute with vigor the operations of the ensuing campaign.
