Mr Cyles informs me that he has been refused Payment of an Order from the Treasury Board upon your State, & that it will be a great Injury to the Public, and subject him to lose a considerable Quantity of Wheat & other Provisions, near to Bennington and Connecticut Rivers, from the Conversation which passed between you Mr Pralby and me, the other day, I have writ Mr Cyles, to send his Assistant Mr Childs to apply for the Amount of the Order, & if it will be paid, this wou'd request you to communicate to the State, & beg them to adopt Ways and Means to discharge the same, have the Honor to be with all Sentiments of Regard
