Sir I have writted on his Excellency the
Cominander in Chief, to know how those men
that have ingaged during the war, that have been
promis'd fifty new dollars each as bounty,
were to give it, he sais the ^{State} only can settle it,
as there is no money in the Pay Masters hands
except what the several States supply him with,
the men are daily calling on me for their bounty,
they must either have it as promis'd them, or
be discharged from the during war enlistment
& enlist for three years, which I think would
be a great pity. I wish to have some direction
respecting the matter, the men are very unsea-
.ey, I think there is about thirty of them,
