Clarendon April 1st 1778

To The Committee of Safety of Exeter

One Levi Warner of this Town, some time last Sept^r clop'd from us to the enemy, & join'd them, and was taken near Fort Edward, as you may see by the letter we receiv'd from the Committee of Albany, which we send to you — You will see by that, what his crime is, & what a trial he has had, likewise the reason of our sending of him to ~~head~~ Headquarters —

Gentlemen, The S^r Levi has been examined by us, & as it appears evident that he has been active against us, we look upon ourselves in duty bound to send him to you, that he may in a proper manner have such a trial as you in your wisdom shall think ~~him~~ the nature of his crime calls for — Should you in your wisdom see fit to bring him upon trial for life, proof sufficient to support the crime elodged against him may be had — As these are those among us, that were out with the Militia when he was taken —
