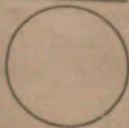

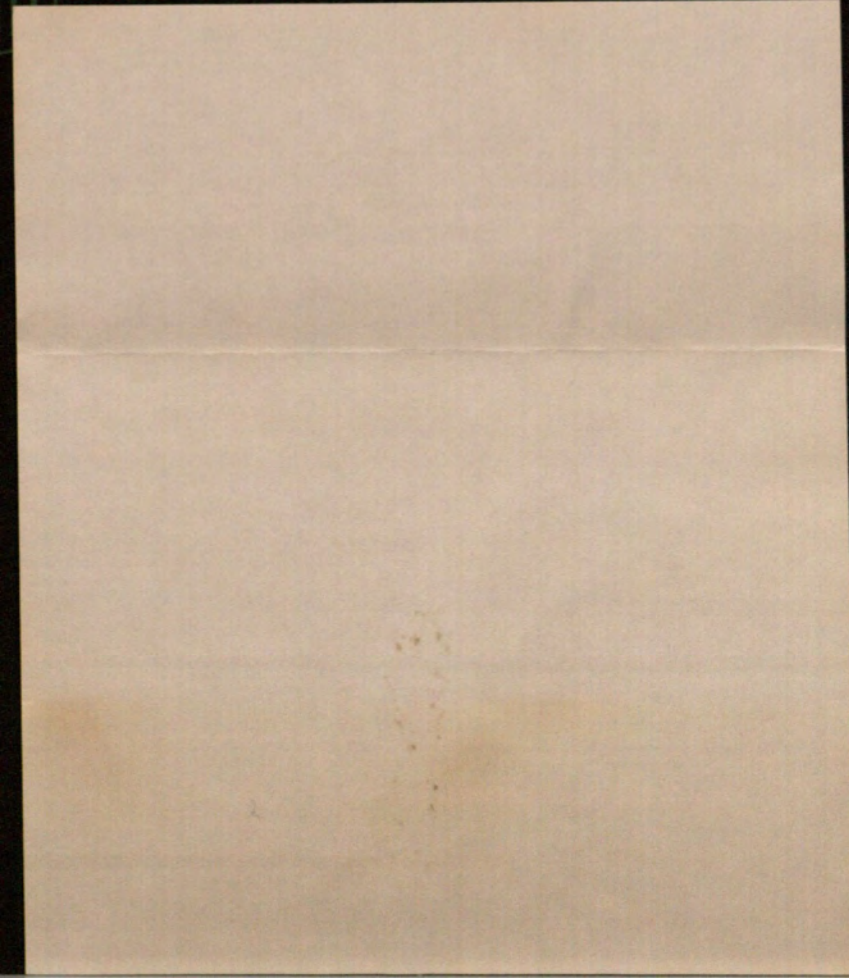
Dearest - beloved,

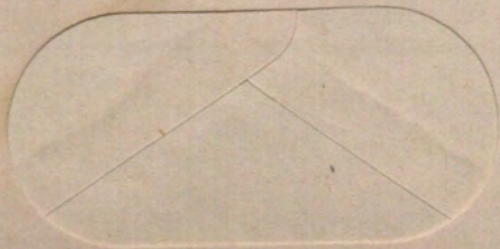
