 relaxing, beautiful and full of thoughts of your

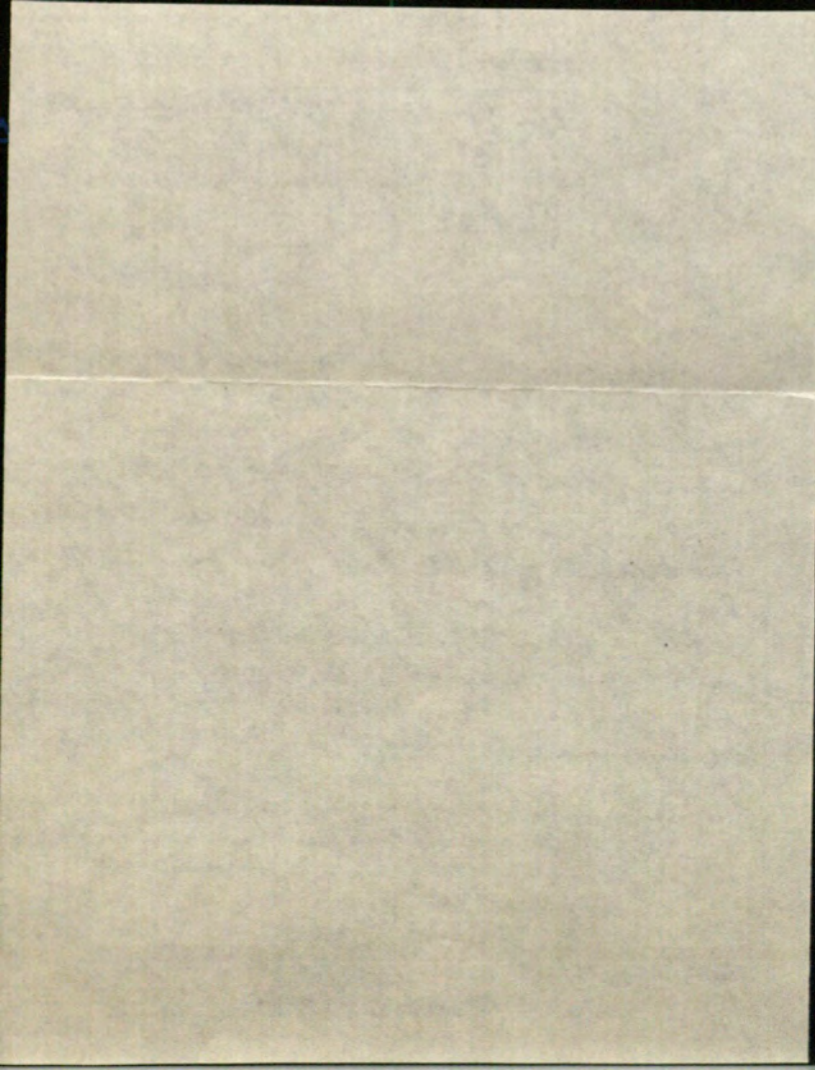
Received your Dec. 16th V. mail and I was so

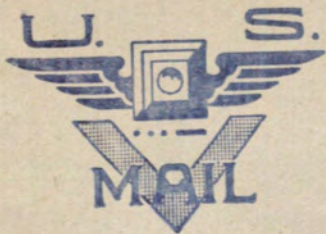
