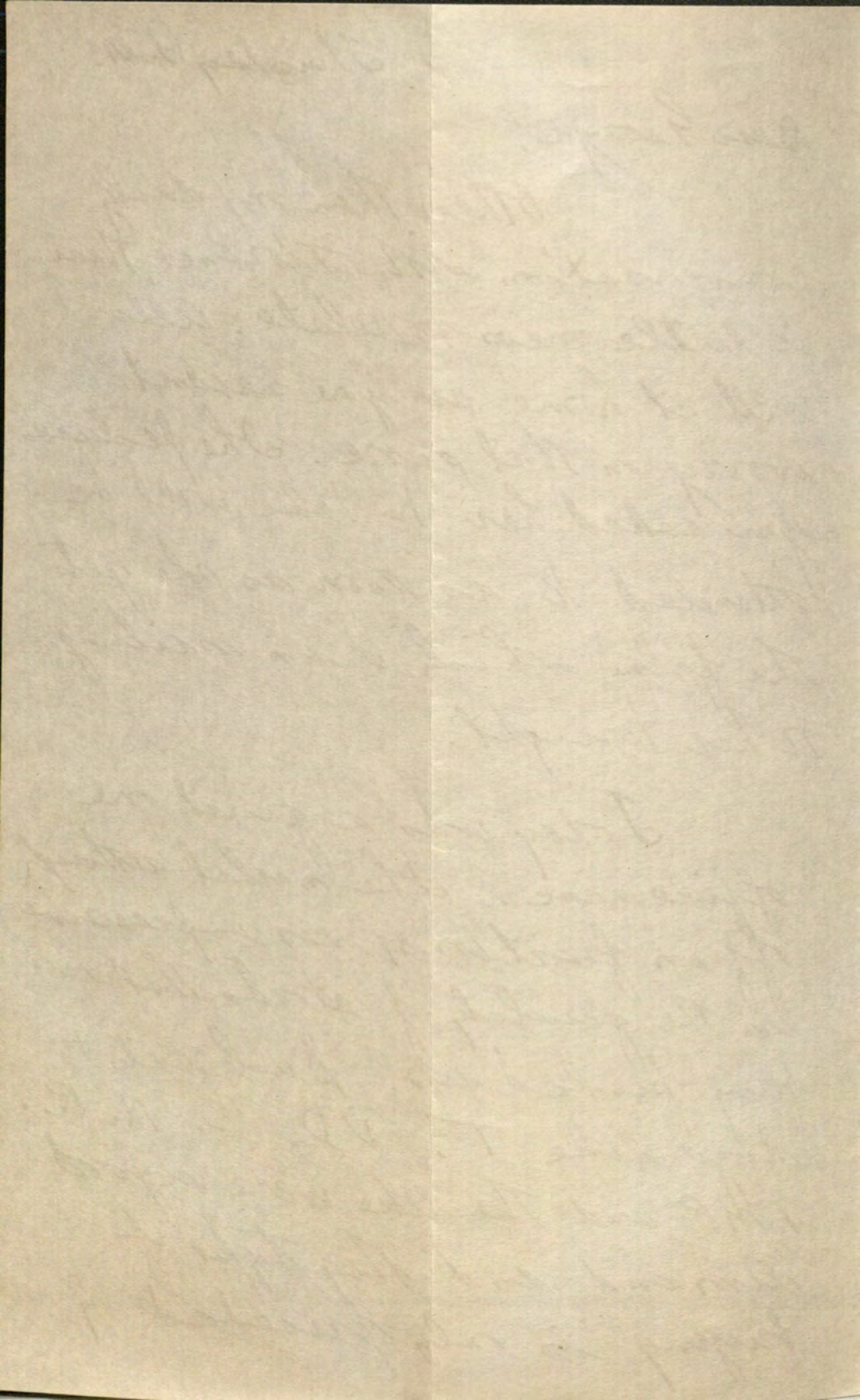


Thursday P. M.
