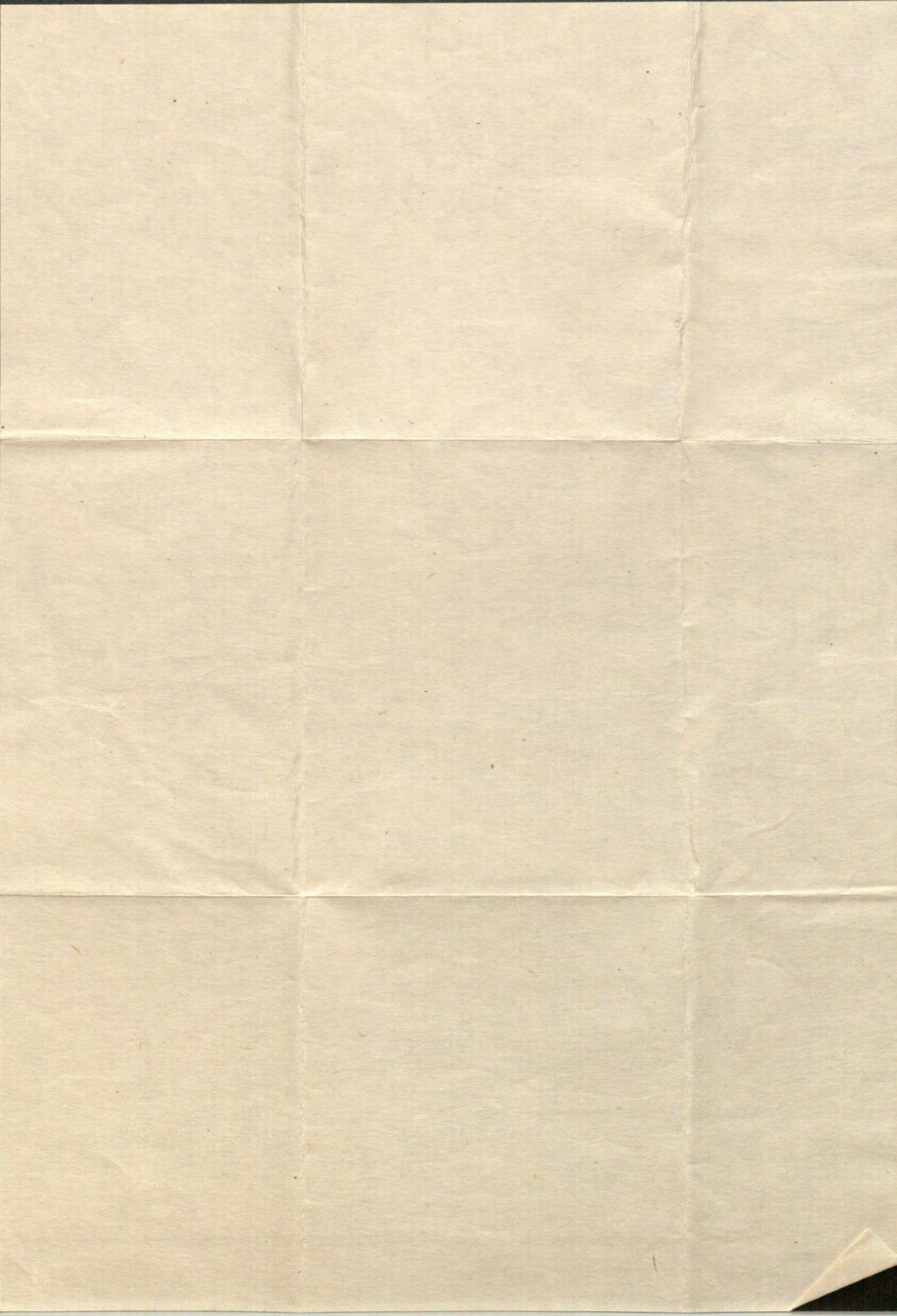

Will write you soon as possible, and remember I'll be loving you always,

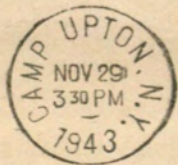
