Noted the new time schedule - in this way we have a longer afternoon to gether. In the morning mail I got your letters of Jan 1st & 3rd and felt much happier after reading them and knowing that you're well. If that \$10 isn't in the Dec 9th, then it surely is in the Dec 10th letter. Up to date I've sent you \$11 or \$12, I'm not sure, and hope you got it all. Shall I send more money? I'm mailing a package to you to-day and the contents are some candy, a map of camps and 2 jars of sulphur cream, your unfinished jars and my concoction also a good pair of sun glasses.

Baby and I are fine and dandy and still miss our most beloved sweetheart and Daddy. The folks are all well and send their best regards and love.

Last night I spoke with D. Abrams - he sends his
best to you. To-day I called your office, spoke to
Mr. Kessler, Mr. Brown and Mr. Pinus, thanked the
first two and asked Mr. Pinus if he needs liquor. When he
does, he'll let me know. Luck Gilbert spoke with me this
morning and is a little worried about her brother. Who's at
Camp Meade. Rumors are that the men are being shipped foot
and furious. So thankful, dearest, that you're not with
a combat unit. Funny, I had a dream about you last
night and also Gladys. You were sent to El Paso and she
was in St. Petersburg, Fla. No significance, my darling, just
a crazy mixed up dream - like this world at present. Did
you hear from Bob and also about that mayor's story?
You Staff boys will have plenty to relate after this war
is over and our hearts are gay again.

Jimmie sure keeps me amused - every once in a while
he tries to stand on his head and is getting affectionate - dearest.

With that same love in my heart and a hug and kiss
