For the last few days I've had little time to write what I really should have written. It's a little difficult for me to concentrate with Jimmie running about and his new habit of vomiting gets me a bit Janicky. He's not the only baby that does that and in a few days he'll be the same good eater he's been until now. But it's a shame that I put so much effort and energy into his meals and I think if I didn't fuss so much he'd be the same kid with his fresh vegetables as with out them. Dr. Ames said not to worry babies are like that and he may be cutting another tooth. Otherwise baby is fine,

cheerful all day long and plays very
nicely in his play den while I'm
doing my household duties and cooking.

In nice weather we're out most of the
afternoon and for the past few days
the temperature hasn't been too low.

When the sky looks clear at night, I mail
your letter air-mail and hope you get
them within three days. Your letters come
almost daily - 3 yesterday, 1 to day and
they're all very eligible, beautiful and
bring only love and happiness to my
lonely heart. I'm sometimes ashamed
that I can't answer them with more
words and expressions of my inner
being but you'll understand that it

all amounts to just those little words "I love you." Now I realize more and more that we're really one and the better part of me is so far away. It's going on nine weeks, dearest, and to me it's like a long bad dream but I'm really trying so hard to take care of myself and baby. This war will change most of us and I sincerely hope I'll be more appreciative of my wonderful husband who's given me nothing but the greatest happiness in the last six years. My life in the past had very little meaning and purpose and was lived on such turbulent waters that after my marriage it was like living

on a beautiful lake, so quiet, serene
and only beauty surrounding it. And
don't worry, my dearest, Jimmie and I will
be the only tenants in C 2, Bess goes
with "Duke" or "Sluke" goes with Bess so
that's settled. Although we haven't even
discussed the possibility of Bess and Jim-
mie with us, Bess may have other plans all
settled. She spoke with me early this
even and is feeling fine, the baby is cut-
ting more teeth and My is gutting his job
this week. Did you get her letter - if so
try to answer it soon and I believe Eleanor
wrote too. Your mother got her letter & said,
thanks, and spoke with me a while ago.

My and Mom were out to meet Sophie
on Sunday and had a very nice time.

Nancy and I couldn't drive out and send their
best regards to you.

Yesterday I forgot to mention that the
Whitmans wrote to me and Peggy ^{mummy} sends their
love to all of us. They like Cal. but not the

Stevens - night work and hasn't called

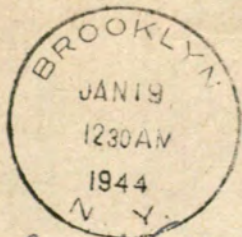
for quite a while - do you hear from them?
