To-day baby and I spent most of the afternoon at my mother's and baby as usual was the center of attention. He's very playful, didn't damage the new furniture and didn't even wet for four hours. We left at 4:45 p.m. and I left him at the sup't while I took the car to the garage. Helma and Joel were also with us and are both fine. While there, Bess called to tell

the news - My has been rejected, reasons flat feet and curvature of the spine. Now she hasn't a thing to worry about and should get rid of her colitis pronto. Can you figure it out? Frankly, I am only happy for Bessie's sake.

Last night, I listened to the radio until 9.30 and then went to sleep. Baby awake at 1.30 a.m. was restless, wet, I awake, took care of him and we both fell asleep soon after. In the morning, we had our breakfasts, first a good morning to you and then the Household Chores. I'm working on the bedroom drawers now.

The folks are all well and I wrote to Bob last night. Just spoke to Pop who was on his way to the dentist. Love from both Mom and Pop.

Excuse the very short letter, dearest, but I'm a little tired and feel a bit ~~depressed~~ <sup>depressed</sup> maybe it's just loneliness for you.
