Mom and Pop are fine, rode with us from Brooklyn and I dropped them off at your Uncle Harry's. He'll send their love <sup>to</sup> you. Then on to the Tickers where we spent the day and I will tell you all about it in to-morrow's letter.

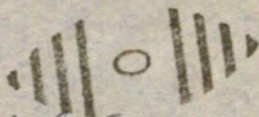
