Jimmie is getting older and in a few months, if all goes well, I would  
love to be near you. The weather will be nicer and I feel quite  
strong again. To think that soon it'll be 3 months since I saw you  
last. I guess so many strange things happen in a lifetime and  
we seem to get stronger with each bad break. It's a good feeling  
to know that we love one another so dearly and this separation will  
soon pass and then happiness will reign again for us and our  
loved ones. I just hope it won't be too long.

I have to prepare baby's bath so I'll say good-afternoon  
darling and until to-morrow all my love and devotion to you  
and a kiss and hug from baby.
