I'm getting a little impatient but I guess after a

from you, I hope. No news since your Tuesday letter and
I'm so curious to know all about your set-up.

All your folks are well and send their love. My
sister Helma and Joel also spent a few hours here today
and Joel and Jimmie are very fond of one another. Mom and

box of Barta's chocolates as a gift. I showed off your
pictures to all the family and they all remarked how
well you look. About 4 o'clock all but Helma and Joel
left and I had a slight headache from being indoors
