night's weather is snow or rain. Mom  
and Pop are fine, visited Harry yesterday  
and called me this afternoon to say  
that all is well. Harry is home and is  
up and about which is very foolish of him.  
He goes out into the street and walks around  
too much, so mom says.

Received your Wednesday and Thursday  
letter this morning and in case was the  
weekly schedule. Also got your package  
of letters and contents. Thanks a million



for everything. Just wrote a long letter to Bob and we're all so glad that he'll be in Santa Ana for 3 or 4 weeks more.

Billy Rubel and Sunny called again today and send their best regards to you. Eleanor and my mother both have colds and my mom is going up to the country either today or to-morrow to see Bess.
