you in mind

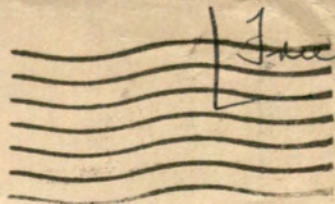
