Mom and Pop just left me after having spent most of day with Jimmie and me. We had all hoped to hear from you but were not too disappointed as we realize you're in the army and may still be at the rifle range. But I do hope all is well and that I'll get some news from you to-morrow morning.

Haven't heard from you in two days and am anxious to know what happened all week.

The folks are fine and had a grand time with Jimmie. The weather was too cold, although I did venture out this

morning, and we spent the day
indoors. Baby and I are also feeling fine
and miss you more than ever, especially
on Sundays.

Irving Goldfarb called last night,
after I mailed your letter, and was so
sorry he couldn't get around to visit us.
He was hoping, as was I, that we'd make
the trip down to N.C. with he and his wife
but at present I have to sit tight.

(See) During the day we talked about
the war and how good it was going.
Jimmie supplied all the entertainment
and happiness and how he loves to be
watched and played with (that's only on

Sundays and holidays). He's now fast asleep, after having a good supper. The folks had supper with me and also stayed a little while after.

Eleanor called and didn't feel too well, her sinus is bothering her as a result of a cold. Her best regards to you - also my Mom's. Ralph Weinberg called, he chewed the fat for 15 minutes and wishes to be remembered to you. I think

he mentioned that he wrote to you. His ~~high~~ ~~now~~ have the measles. (Just filed it for you) A few minutes ago Mr. Brown

phoned and enquired about all of us. He's fine and will call again a few days.

I'll try to call Mr. Brown to-morrow as I haven't spoken with him this month yet.

Expect to go to the beauty parlor to-
morrow to have my hair set and nails
manicured - for no occasion - just for
the hell of it. Also have an appointment for
baby with Dr. Carnes for a check-up and
will let you know all about precisions.

My love for you is the same as always -
with all my heart I love you and cherish
all those moments I've ever been with you!
Meanwhile I keep on wishing for that
reunion and hope it will be soon.

Keep well, dearest, and baby and I
will keep that courage going. Love from the father
