

Tuesday evening -
March 28th 1944.

Dearest beloved,

Baby and I are feeling fine and dandy and hope you're the same. I still love you so dearly and can hardly wait until we're together again. Somehow the sun looks brighter and my spirit is quite high. Just thinking about being near you thrills me.

The weather was much nicer today, after yesterday's rain, and baby and I went walking after lunch. We shopped and stayed outdoors for a few hours. After getting back into the apartment, Mr. Parker came to see me. He brought release papers, an affidavit and a check for the claim.

The amount was $\$13.00$ and only this morning
when I spoke to the manager I was offered
\$10.00 and no more. It was take it or leave
it but I managed to wrangle out that
extra three dollars so here's one for you.
I'll send more if you request it but I don't
know when you'll be moved and I don't want
to have the letters following you.

In the morning I spoke to Max Eiden
about increasing the insurance and he'll call me
in a day or so about it. ^(Pavel) Billy called at 9:45
last night and told me about what's going
on with the fellow craft club. He sends his
best regards to you and hopes to see you
soon. He is a swell friend. No mail

from you that I did get a birthday
card from Bob. Just spoke to my sister
Eleanor and we've more or less decided to
go up to Pers's place a week from Fri-
day April 7th. Is that date interfering
with any plans? At present my Aunt Mildred
is with me and may stay overnight. She came
to visit us this afternoon and Thelma and Jack
and I were here for a short time. They're
all fine and send their regards to you.

This week I'll take stock of baby's
wardrobe and also mine and will get
ready only the necessary things. Think well
because I hope I'm not dreaming about
all this planning and hoping to be
near my beloved.

We took some more snaps and I'm
mailing the roll of films to-night to ~~Frank~~
Telen. Also included is your negative which
I'm having enlarged.

Baby is in slumberland after having
a busy day. He's doing much better
with his cup drinking but I still have
to help him with the spoon. Time will
take care of that too.

Keep well and just tell our folks
go through. All my love and devotion
to you, my dearest. A kiss and hug from
baby. Your folks are fine and send their
love, too. Regards from Aunt Mildred.
