The Southern hospitality you hear so much about, is a thing of the past. When I attended S.A.U. I saw some of this, but since the war, that has all changed.

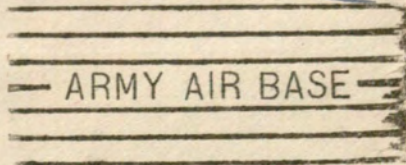
