Sometimes I wish I was like a hunk of wood because of the extreme emotions I feel good through within a few minutes time. GPs, my dearest, it's loving you and wanting you that makes me that way. My dreams will come true by the end of this month, I hope.

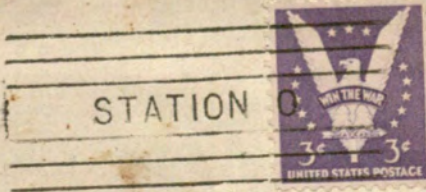
The weather turned cold again after lunch today and baby and I decided to stay indoors. My Aunt Mildred called at 1:30 and suggested that I go shopping. So she came soon after and I ran into the city, bought two lovely single hats, one red, one green and some trimmings. Arrived home at 6 and all was well with our precious one but he's so attached to me that when I came in the door he was wild with joy. He behaved very nicely while I was gone and gave my Aunt no trouble at all. Then he had a nice supper and went to bed, early with a bottle. Yes, my love, he's back on

the bottle again because he spills more milk from the
cup and I lack't the heart to yep him any longer. Betty
brought Lawrence in for a short while to-night while she
said a "shiva" visit. Ben just picked up the kid and took
him upstairs half asleep.

Very few calls to day - just from the family, Mom and
Pop and Sonny. All is well on the home front and Mom doesn't
think she'll be able to go with us on Friday. I'm afraid, darling,
that we need you around to encourage ^{her} or take her anywhere. They
received mail from Bob saying that he may be transferred again
but in the meantime he's having a good time. I think your cousin
Aaron goes any day into the Navy and his wife and babe may
move in with your Aunt Sophie. Sonny is feeling quite restless
these days and wishes it was all over. Her best regards to
you. Love from the folks.

Received your Saturday letter this morning and also the
Masonic program this afternoon. Plenty of brides and bridesmaids in
the state of Maine. Still glad about your better living quarters
and healthier climate and I just know we'll love it when we
get out there. If you're looking around for a place for us please
