The kids always have fun, especially when the trains go by and I, too, have a good time dreaming of you and talking about you. The gang send their best to you.

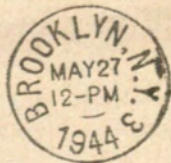
Just finished another letter to Bob and I do hope his eyes act up again and get him some break. Mom and Pop got a letter from him to day and also one from you.
