

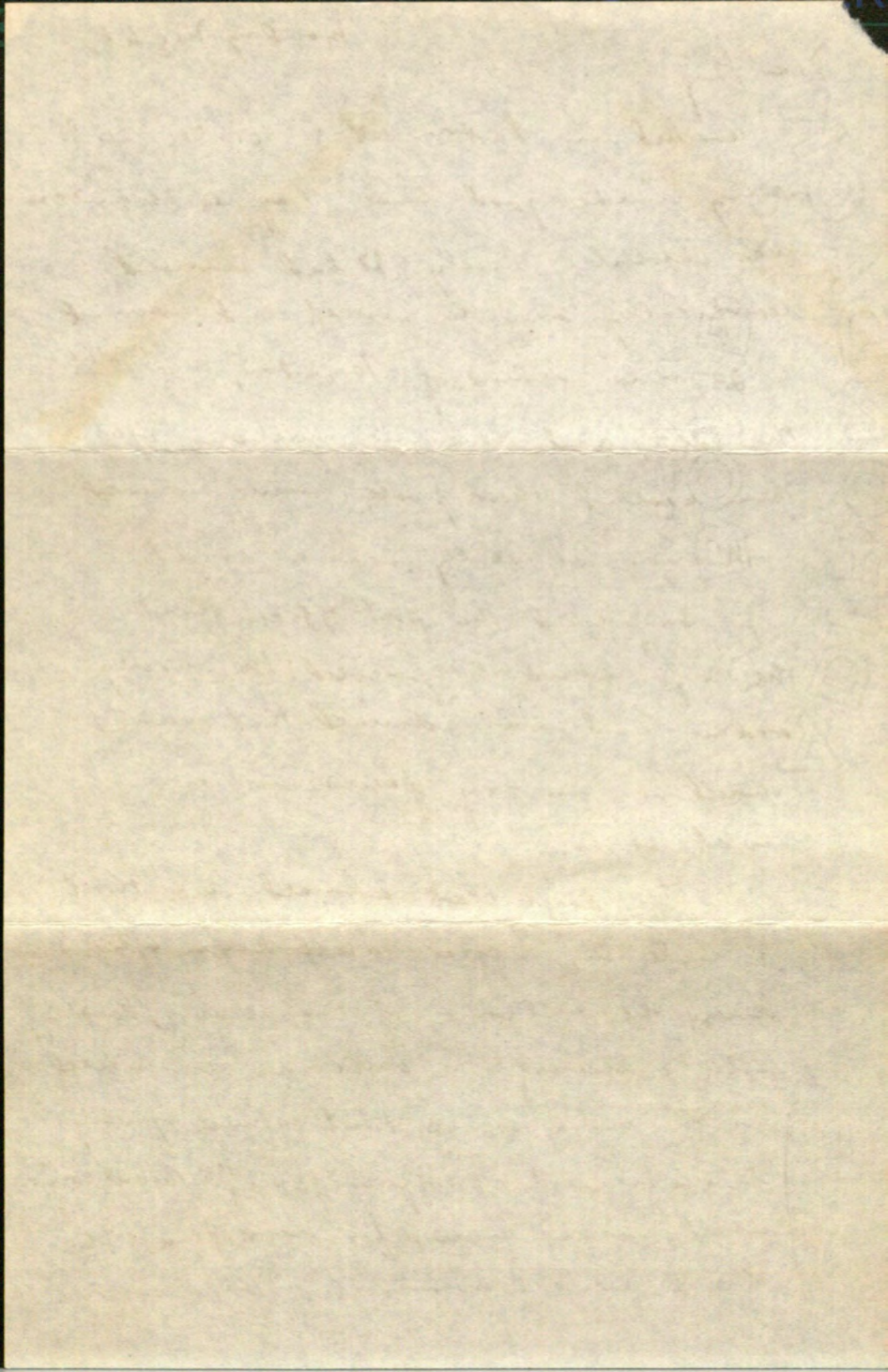
Monday night.

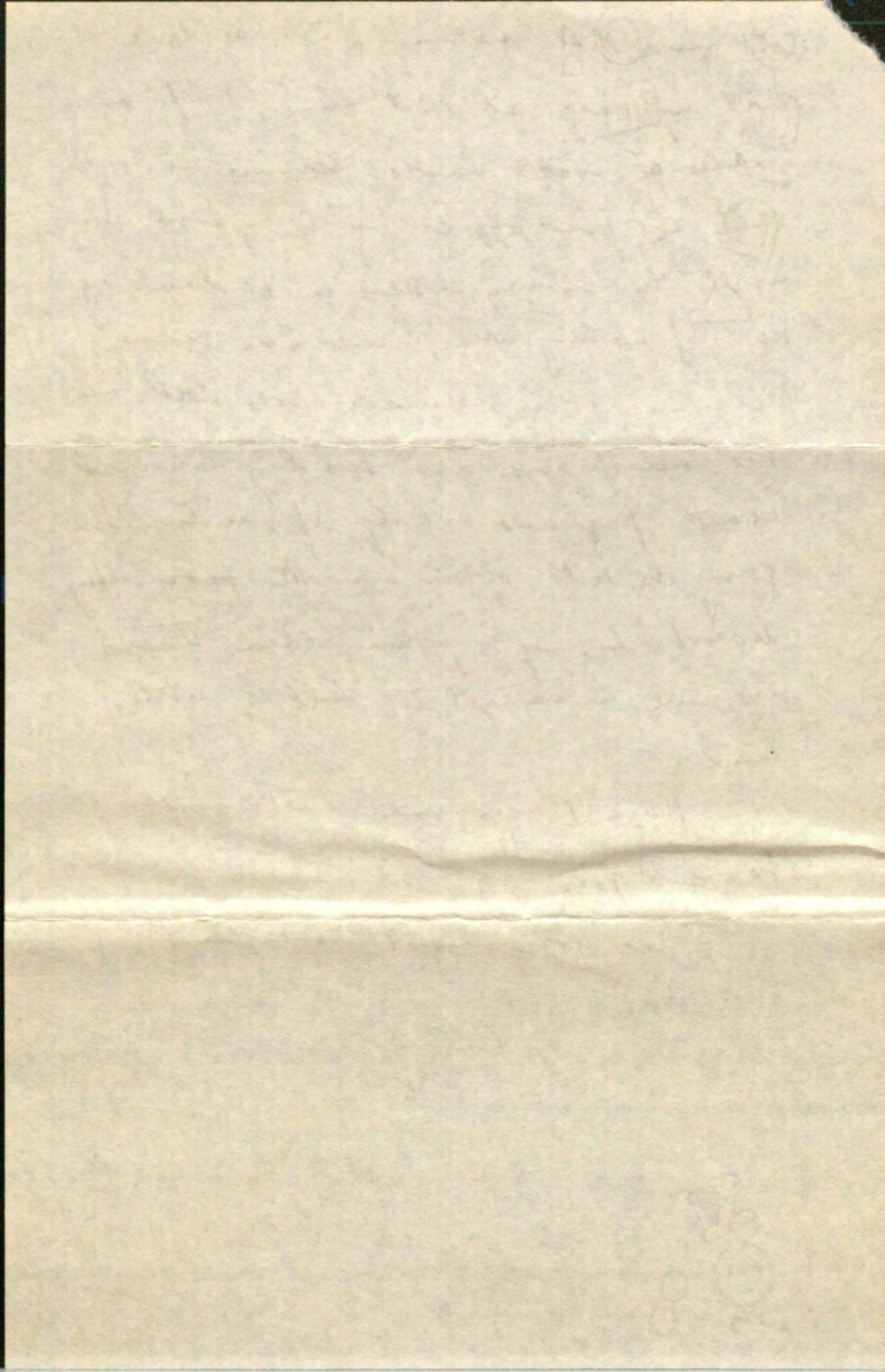


told me that nothing will be done
