Bliss and they treat me well and we'll probably see another night here before the winter is over. Jim and I still love you so dearly and miss you so much.

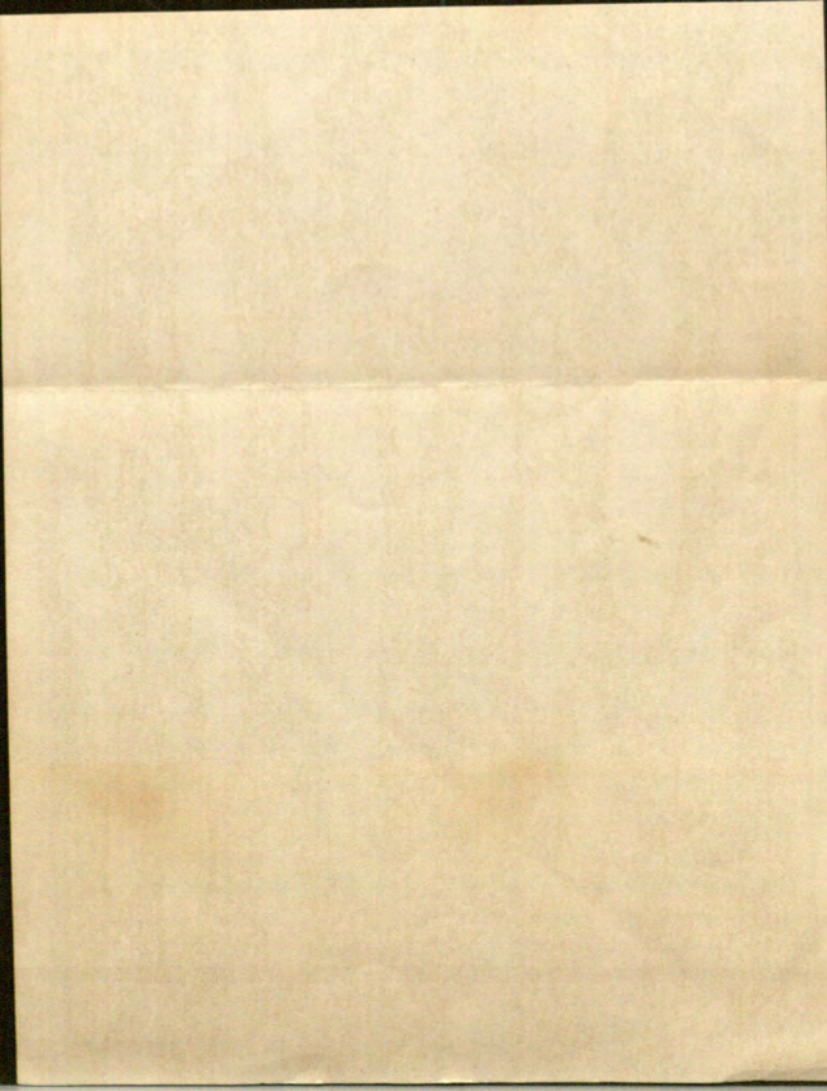
