Dearest George,

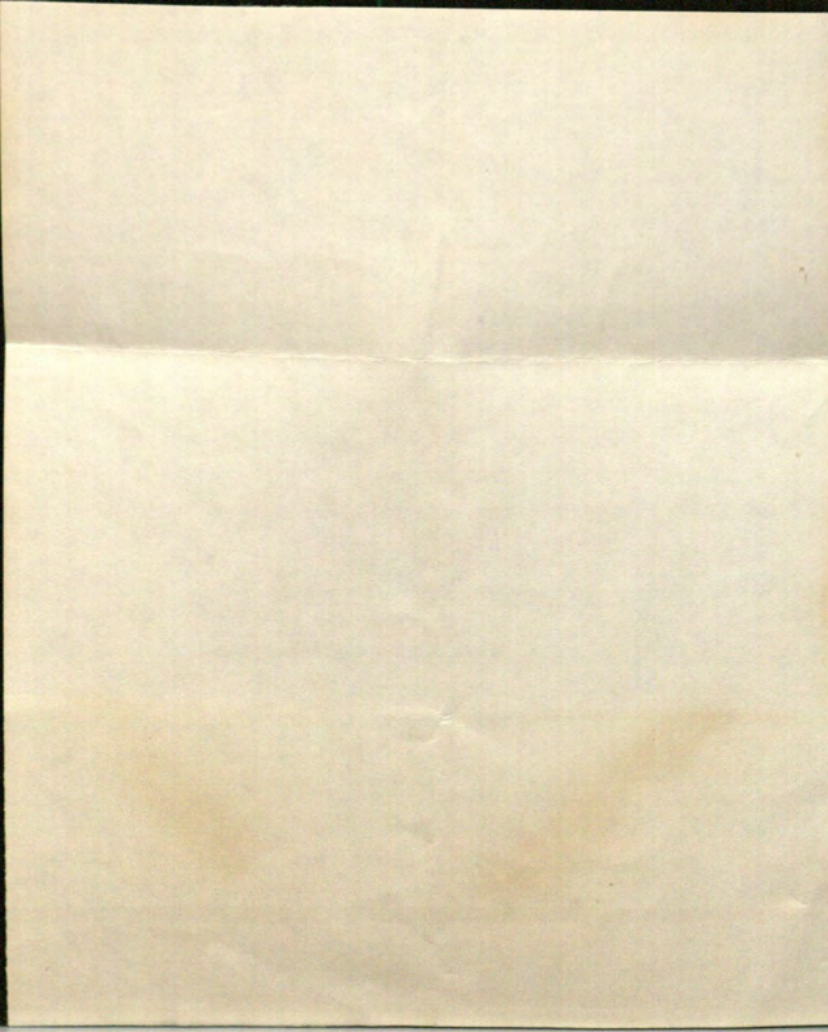

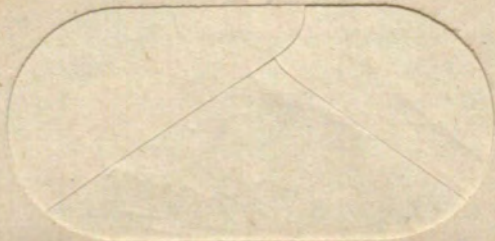
