At all times it is our duty to acknowledge the over ruling providence of the great governor of the Uni verse and devoutly to emplore his devene favourand protection. But in the hour of calamity and impending danger when by fore and the sowed, by the savages of the welderness, and by our own do= mesties, a vinductive enemy pursues a war of rapin and devastation with unrelenting fury; we are peculiarly excited with true penitone of heart to prostrate ourselves before our great breator, and Jervently to supplicate his gracious interposition for our deliverance.

The United States in bonges apenbled, therefore do earnestly recommend that Thursday the third day of May nest may be of served as a day of humiliation fasting and pray or, that we may with United hearts configured beword our manyold sins and transgressions, and by sincer repentance and amendment of life

appeare his nighteous displeasure, and through the merits of our blefred Saviour oblain pardon and for-

That it may please him to inspire our tulers with wisdom, and uncorruptable integri ty and to duct and prosper their Councils to in spew all our bitizens with a fewent and disinterested love of their bountry, and to preserve and strengthen their Union; to turn the hearts of the dis affected, or to flustrate their devices; to regard with deveni compassion our funds in captivity afflution and distress, to comfort and reluce them under their sufferings, and to change their ment mouning into grateful songs of trumph; That it may please him to bless our ally, and to render the connection formed between these United States and his Thingdom, a mutual and leasting benefit to both nations; to animate our officers and forces by sea and land with invencible fortitude, and to quard and protect them in the day of battle; and to crown our joint endeavours for turninaling the calamities of war with victory and success, that the blessings of peace and liberty may be established on an honorable and permanent beises and transmitted inviolate to the latest

posterity: that it may please him to prosper our husbandry and commerce and to bless us with health and plenty that it may please him to bless all schools and seminaries of learning and to grant that truth justice and benevolence and pure and undefiled religion may unwer sally prevail. Und it is recommended to all the people of these States to apsemble for publish wor ship and abstain from labour on said day -Done in Congres the twents eth day of March in theyear of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty one and in the fifth of the independence
