him suffer and tucked him in for the night.

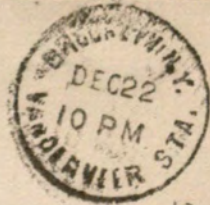
Spoke to Eleanor and Sonny to-night. Betty came
