

Mon. Feb 14, 1944.

Dear Gery.

This should be a fairly long letter, if I ever get around to writing it and more important than that finishing it. It is now exactly 4:20 P.M. and will see what I can accomplish before closing time.

First my apologies for not having answered your last letter any sooner, but as you must have been informed by Florence that I was home on leave and as I too took a leave. Here is the story.

Bernie started getting hot and his induction was getting quite imminent so he thought that he would very much get out to see Paul before he went in. This all took place around the middle of January. I told him that I would come along provided a furlough came along. Well suddenly I was selected by my Major to go to Drome Tas School for the week January 24 - to 30 inclusive. The E/M of the school put me down to make it. It was a course given for the Internal Revenue Men of Beaumont and Webster and just as E/M to learn about something in a week that they have been studying for 10-20 years. So it was arranged for me to get a 15 day furlough commencing February 1, 1944 with a two day pass for the

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Sunday as Monday intervening. Then suddenly the
preceding Friday night Hal calls up (he having been
advised of our contemplated plans) and says that he will be
coming home around the 26th. So our goes our trip to
the coast. I like the income tax cause and it really is a huge
something, I believe you would get quite a bit to be in on. It
really is terrific for somebody who has a bit of a background in
income tax work. But to me, I am in a fog. Luckily, I only
have to go for 3 days and go off for the rest. Hal came in
on Wednesday and I start my furlough on Friday morning for 14 days
to end on February 10, because Hal leaves on Feb 9. Benie
on the Tuesday previous to Hal's arrival gets himself inducted into
the NAVY. Just couldn't talk himself out of this one. Well we
had two of the swellest weeks of our life. Went to the Geyser, to
the Cape Catman, San Mexican Magazine, Wenger Valley, Cammer Jones,
Oldham, and Hal also saw On Touching Venus. It's practically
impossible to get there to Tibet, there being such a black market.
Hal flew back Wednesday night, was grounded Thursday
morning in Chicago, had weather and forwarded by train
and supposed to have arrived in San Diego yesterday afternoon.
Benie goes into the Navy next month. So that about
is all in our furlough. It sure was great while it lasted.

Meanwhile I was supposed to go out on a WAC Recruiting
drive, but after it all being set up (6 week trip upstate)
my Major says no dice.

Well there about all for me now about you. Flebman
has told me something about your attending E/M. School on
Administration. What can give me all the bloody details
all of them. And if you can see if you can swing a little 7 day
delay enroute. Going there and get him, it would be good
seeing you. Hal and I were over to see that kid of yours and
he sure is well his. (Show you that out) In spite of you he
will turn out to be a good man. Hal attends one of the meetings,
some sample of bench flying under some other attendees Kelly &
Mickey Ravel's installation.

Well it's 4:55 and retreat is on its way so I'll sign off with
the hope that you are well and enjoying your health. Stay well.
