Sullivan and Bengston's performance recognized with All-East selections

Sophomores Jeff Sullivan and Andy Bengston have proved that they are the future of men's cross country at Keene State College.

Both runners were selected to the All-East Cross Country team for their strong performances at the National Collegiate Athletics Association (NCAA) Division II Eastern Cross Country Regionals held at Kutztown University

in Pennsylvania on Saturday. Sullivan finished the 10 kilometer course in a time of 31:54.9, a personal record; this was good enough for the eighth place overall.

His teammate, Bengston, finished eleventh with a time of 32:07.6, also a personal best. Head coach Peter Thomas is pleased with the performances of both runners and said that their work at the regionals should be a big confidence booster for them.

Bengston and Sullivan's times were enough to pace Keene State to a fourth place finish in the 27 team field.

• Heather Boisvere named to NECC All-Conference Team; three Lady Owls named to second team

Sophomore midfielder Heather Boisvere is one of four members of the Keene State College women's soccer team who were named to the New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) All-Conference Team.

Boisvere is an example of the determination of the Lady Owls' team. Keene State was labeled as a team in a transition year, but members of the team proved critics wrong.

The Lady Owls compiled a 12-6 record and qualified for the ECAC Division II Tournament for the second year in a row.

As a freshman, Boisvere did not expect to receive much play-

ing time from head coach Denise Lyons, but she proved herself during the team's preseason games and was awarded with a starting position. Heather collected five goals and six assists for 16 points; this includes two goals and one assist in the ECAC Tournament that led her to being named tournament mvp.

Despite collecting 15 points during the regular season and being named to the NECC All-Conference team, Boisvere does not believe she was as successful as last season.

"It's exciting to get the recognition, but I didn't think I played as well as I did last year," said Boisvere. "I just tried to go out and have a better season."

With improvements like this from one of the Lady Owls key players, maybe the loss of midfielder Jeanne McNamara and back Dawn Rothwell, both of whom were named to the NECC second team, to graduation will not hurt as much as originally expected.

Top Keene scorers named All-Americans

Kerrey Pilotte and co-captain Heather Fiske, the scoring backbone of the Keene State College field hockey team, were named to the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II Field Hockey All-American second team.

Fiske is receiving the nod for the second consecutive season and this is the first time Pilotte has received the honor.

The co-captain was second on the team in scoring, trailing only Pilotte, with 10 goals and two assists for 22 points. She also appeared in all 17 games for the Lady Owls.

Her season highlights include game winning goals against Trinity College and Southern Connecticut State University and a three goal performance against Assumption College.

"It's very exciting to receive the honor... it's a great way to finish out my career," said Fiske.

Pilotte's season was equal to Fiske in terms of accomplishments. She led the Lady Owls in scoring for the third consecutive season by accumulating 12 goals, three assists and 27 points. This impressive point total vaulted Pilotte to third on the Lady Owls all-time goal and scoring list; she still has one season to play.

"I was really surprised about receiving the honor," said Pilotte. "It makes you feel that all the hard work during the season was worthwhile."

The Lady Owls will miss the offensive power and ball control skills of Fiske next season, but Pilotte's drive for the all-time scoring title and relentless play should give the team plenty to build on for next year.

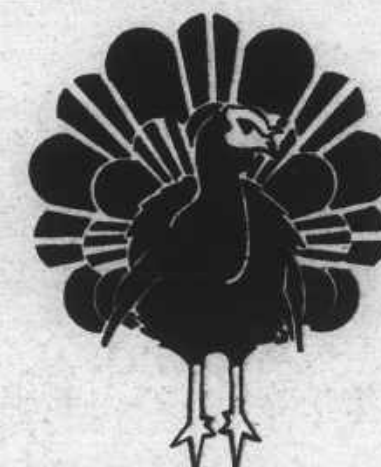

Another student, a butchery major, said the decision will have a dramatic effect on the local turkey population.

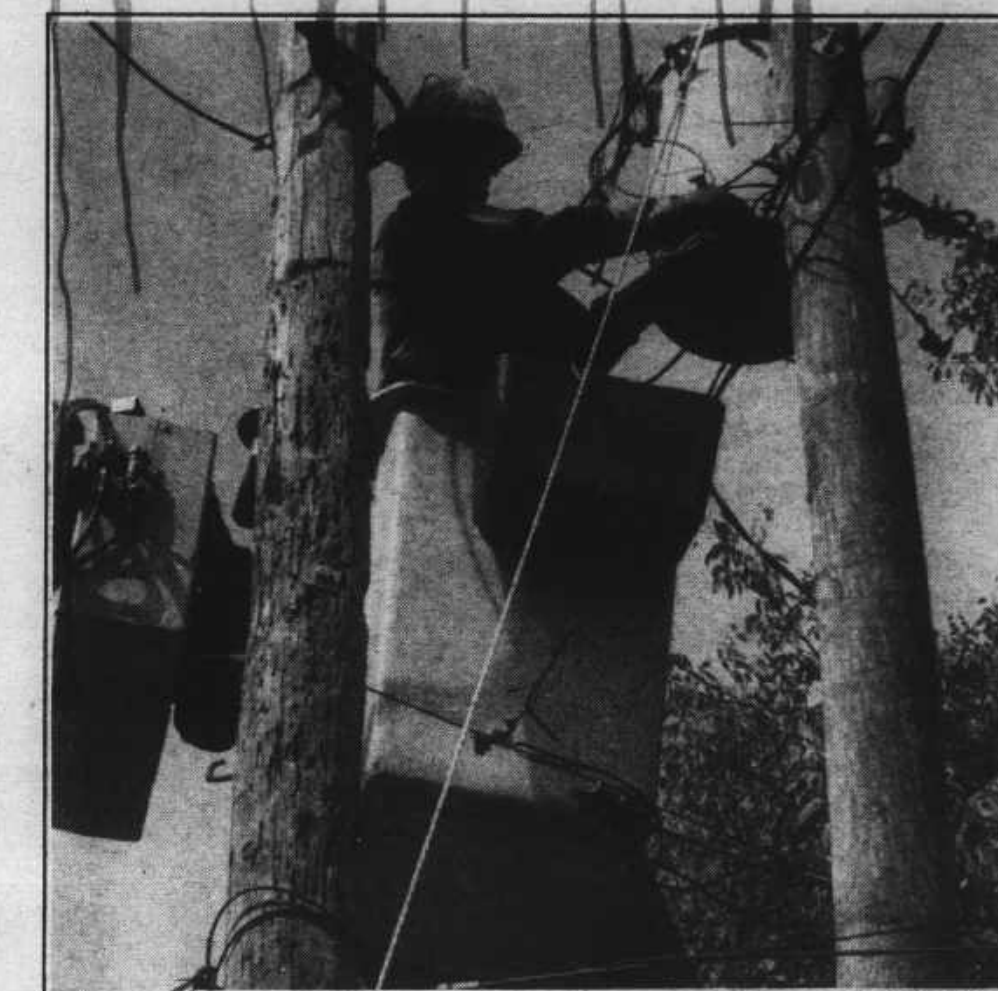
"That's right, we are gonna go crazy with them turkeys this year," he said. "You bop um, I'll pop um, that's what they say."

And a statement made by a past basketball player from Kinda "It was bound to happen, it's hard to be so well supported by the Kinda community you fell that you need to give something back"

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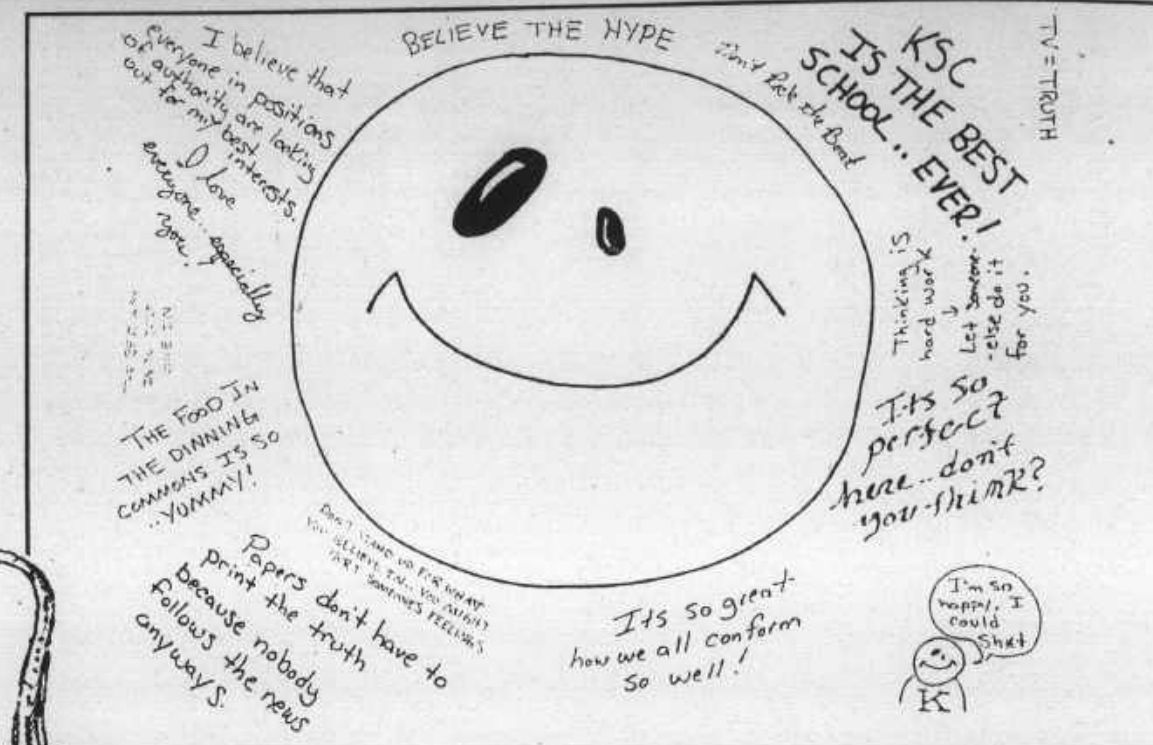

"Kirk est un grand connard et moi, je suis vachement content qu'il est perdu," Kirk's roommate, a confessed exchange student from Venus said sobbing.

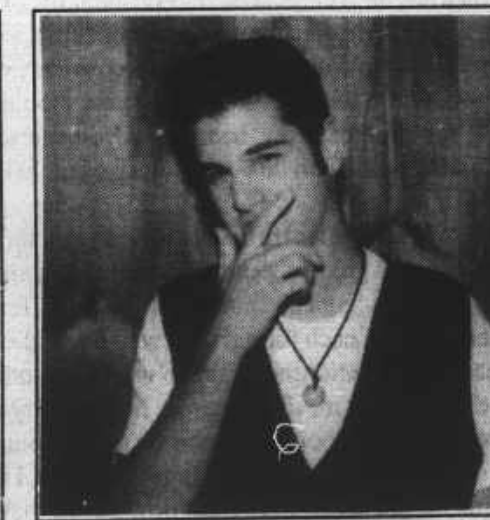

KSC student arrested for making false rape report

A Keene State College student has been arrested on charges of "committing a false report" to the Keene Police Department (KPD), according to Detective James F. McLaughlin of the KPD.

Margaret S. McGinnis, a KSC senior, was arrested at 2:30 pm, on Nov. 17; she will appear in court on December 7, according to the police log.

After McGinnis reported numerous rapes that she claimed were perpetrated by another KSC student against herself,

the officer in charge of the case, Detective McLaughlin, found a discrepancy in the dates given by McGinnis.

"We had investigated the case and found out that the person being accused had some solid alibis and couldn't possibly be involved, and that caused some suspicion," McLaughlin said.

According to the alleged perpetrator, the statement filed with the KPD by McGinnis "named numerous times when I'd raped her repeatedly - all of those times I was at work." The man accused of the crime also said that McGinnis had accused him of raping her in various places

including the Science Center parking lot, and that he had attempted to break into her house.

Now relieved of potential charges, the student said that he feels sympathy for McGinnis.

"I think it's a real tragedy that this happened. I feel really, really bad for Margaret," the student said. "Whatever becomes of this in the end, I do wish her the

best, and I'm sorry that things turned out the way they did."

However, the once-accused student said that he does not know what to expect about the stigma that might continue to surround him.

"We're just going to have to wait and see how things work out," the student said. "I'm not nervous, I maintain my

In addition to the college's teacher evaluations, the class surveyed 539 additional students to find what professors are most helpful to Keene State students.

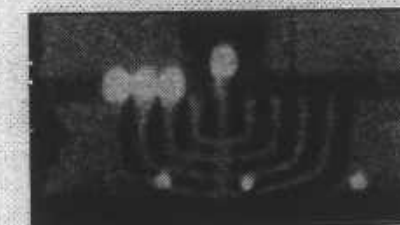
The goal is to give students insight when registering during class selection.

Controversial study finds teachers "overprepared" for classes

A memorandum regarding the growing number of "underprepared" students on college campuses world-wide suggests new methods for teaching which some members of Keene State College find unsatisfactory.

The document, which was distributed by the Instructional Innovation Center of KSC to campus professors, was originally published by the Professional and Organizational De-

velopment Network in Higher Education (P.O.D. Network).

The memo has sparked controversy at KSC by asking the question, "What happens when the under prepared student meets the over prepared professor?"

Dr. Carl Granquist, a history professor at KSC, said that the memo implies to him that the "overprepared teachers" are the problem, not the "under prepared students."

Granquist also said that he did not understand the concept of being overprepared in any

profession.

"I do not subscribe to the idea that somebody can be overprepared in their field," Granquist said, then asked, "If you go in to a doctor, you need a serious operation or advice about a medical problem, is it possible for the doctor you see to be 'overprepared', or to be overconfident?"

Granquist said that the letter is part of a movement to get away from many standard tools of teaching, and put the classroom emphasis on having fun and getting in touch with

one's self.

"There's an effort to get away from the content, there's an effort to get away from lecturing, there's an effort to get away from any kind of challenging sort of courses," Granquist said.

The memorandum lists seven examples of how professors should attempt to become mentors for their students, a method proven successful by the implementation of supplemental instruction programs, according to the document.
