nor act against the Estates of Americans

I need there fore inform your Honors that the aforesaid
Capt Woodbury thinks it a grievance to lay under such a bond
when there is nothing further brought against him

His Conduct has been good ever since he has been under them
So far as has fallen under my notice Except the affair
between him and Joseph Hull which affair has been left
to impartial men & Capt Woodbury is cleared from the
Charge and recovered Cost — there fore gentlemen

I see no cause why Capt Woodbury may not be
discharged — I am your most obedient
