Master of Education in Special Education Certification: General Special Education (K-12)

Summer 2010 Start: Applications accepted beginning October 2009

Keene State College's M.Ed. in Special Education combines special education certification and professional leadership coursework. The program culminates with a school-based research project showcasing your area of expertise and leadership capacity in special education. Faculty are dedicated to preparing skilled special educators by partnering with local special education professionals. *Three to six credits are waived for KSC elementary, early childhood, and secondary education majors who complete foundational special education coursework.*

Program features

- One year (full-time) or two-year (part-time) completion options
- Coursework and field experiences (K-12)
- Collaborative internship with supports from both KSC faculty and site-based professionals
- Professional growth through school-based research

The program assists you to

- Apply special education knowledge and skills to help your students with disabilities develop academic, social, and transition skills to become meaningful, productive community members
- Design instruction, assessment, and individualized programs for students and their families
- Collaborate with special education stakeholders within and outside a school system
- Celebrate diversity in the context of supporting individuals with disabilities
- · Advocate for individuals with disabilities
- Develop belief and value systems that provide a focus for acting as a special educator
- Reflect on practice to increase special education knowledge, skills, and beliefs
