Hatford May 19th 1778 Sir As it is of the utmost simportance in the great bontest in which we are ingaged, that Unanimity and Harmony should ful-sist and be maintained; and a Similarity of Measures below fued, by the respective Males: It is with great Inwittgand Concern, we hear that your state, with any other, have hitherto delined acceeding to those necepary & falutary Measures reported by the Convention of New Haven fin Comfliance with and Purfume of a Prefotation Congress, recommending the fame; and tho many Objection sand Difficul ties lie in the way, and bruth Delivary, veemed to attend; yet confidering it was the united Voice of the Measure Hated, that frointed out the Expediency that ity aind Newforty of the Measure: and being the only Means that would be devived for giving an immediate theek to the rapid Depreciation and Extertion, Shirk like a Deluge, vermed to threaten wwwith immediate Truin; unless refrained by forme fovereign Att, until the more effectual and radical, but flower Premedies of Taxation &c. could be applied, felt and perceived; which when effected, and the Tide once changed, the Regulating System, having thew answered the Ind designo, would of Course fall to the Ground, as aufeles Machine Impreford with the fordeas, this Hate were induced to comply fully with the Measures recommended, confiding in our Sister States, that they exould do the fame, and not break that Whion and interrupt that Harmony on which our safety, so much dependes. And the noestate is per hape, more affected in its relative Interest, by the Regulation than this; as the timy have drawn, and fill continue to draw their chief Supplies, especially of the Meatitions from hence: yet every partial View hashen obliged to give way to the Voice of the Convention, the Voice of Congress

and the general Good. Senfylvania, New Jorsey and New York, weunderstand, have a dopted the Steafures, and are determined to inforce them; with whom we shall coroflerate : and had the Eastern Hates done the fame is cannot imagine we whould have feen ever this, very happy Offecto therefrom. Butyour negliting it, has thrown us into great Ombarraforments, and prouse very injurious to those States that have come into the Mafure, and must wintually tend to ruin and defeat the whole . We must beg Leave therefore to call your immediate Attention to this important Object, and to request your Determination thereon, that we might be enabled to take fuch further Mafures as may be found requested. At the same time we cannot but flatter surselves, from your former Readines to Join in fuch Meafures as have heretofore been thought necessary for the general Good; that you will most heerfully Coroperate with us in the most fall dary and important Han Samwith Esthemand Regard (in Behalfo) the Ascembly of the State of Connecticut) Your Honors moft obedient humble Serv!
