Sir

One Timothy Kimball a Lad of fourteen years of age from Rumney a Soldier in Capt. Roberson's Company in one of the N. H. Regiments fell sick in this Town (where he has been about 18 days) on his way to head Quarters.

He is something better but not able to proceed he has no Money (nor can tell Money) nor ability to go forward will by no Means pass Muster at Camp enlisted only for one Year.

The Select Men of Dunstable Refuse to provide for his present Support or do any thing else for him. —

I was lately in the Continental Army & in the service of this State, ^{but now am invalid} I do not know ~~any thing else~~ ^{what} I can do but order him to head Quarters at Exeter. I am humbly of Opinion
