George, my love,

It's true that the time is going fast and to-morrow will be ten weeks that you're gone. I've missed you every moment, I still love you so dearly and will continue loving you as long as there's a breath in me. It's a wonderful feeling, dearest, to know that you feel the same way and I'll also try my dearest to give you only happiness in the future when all this unpleasantness is in the past.

Today I received your Sunday letter and also the telephone bill which was \$14.05. I surely thought it would be more but the calls amounted to \$1.75 & \$3.10 (plus tax). Instead of going downtown for the car plates I'm going to send a check with a filled in form that I got 8. day from a policeman. It will save me time and effort. Those allotment checks for your folks didn't come through as yet and I did get

that authorization document that you sent 12 days ago. If those checks come through next month I'll get a bond for February.

In your letter, you mentioned that you may be in the office of the 5th Bn. for a few months and if that's certain I would like to spend some time near you when the weather gets nicer. But I know how difficult it is to make plans so I'll just bide my time and hope for the best. That interview you spoke about still is not too clear to me but as you say perhaps the matter isn't entirely settled as yet.

Baby and I are feeling swell, spend a good part of the day outdoors when it's nice and we're both eating rather good again. I'm also sleeping and resting more. Helma and Joel spent the afternoon here and the kids had a nice time playing and listening to the nursery records. Jimmie only insisted on stopping the record and getting into all sorts of corners and positions in the room. But he's a dear just like his Daddy. Herbert just called and sends regards. Spoke to the folks all's well on the home front. Jules called too.

Good night, sweetheart and all my devotion and love to you. A kiss from baby.
