Sound that some Persons, influenced by Avaice or Divassection and wine at that time of any souther Law, supplied the Meets of Brilain from time to time with Mails, Hards and Spans, under suctence of exporting those time with Mails, Hards and Spans, under suctence of exporting those third in the French & Stands in the Mest indies, and other suffers this somewhat disposed; bequently gave the Enemy opportunities of capturing valuable Coargons of ward thicker by incantiously transfer - ling them to foreign & Markets.

The General Court of the State of Massachus chts Bay were no former apprised of a practice dangerous in it's consequences and evidently ten ding to feroe our Enemies and distress our Triends, than they passed di etet prohibiting under faver penallies the exportation ofany Masto, Hards and Space from faid State of litteen Inches Liameter and up wards, unlife by peringsion specially obtained for that purpose from the General Court under the Seal of the State, or from the Governor and Council in the recess of said Court, which etet has been received And is still in force; and as the present shattened condition with parts, must greatly inhance the value of those articles arrongous Enomies, and consequently holdry an additional incitement to the commission of those boils which the vaid etet was intended to prevent; it is therefore more thran probable that some Individuals in those States where no fimilar prohibitory Laws are now in being may be induced from lucrative or other Motives to suffly the Said Heets with Masts, Hards and Spars, Articles of which they are on quations and connot otherwise obtain but at an expense and delay that must quartly retard their operations and facilitate those of Our Gorerous Ally. Hence we Condude that every State, that has not always made effectual progision for the purpose, will see fevere restrictions; but such is our Confidence in the wis dom and

patriotism of the Government of New Tanywhire that we are fensible it is order necessary to point out the probable existence of an Evil of the present magnitude, in order to induce the Legislature of that Rate to adopt the most freedy and offectual measures to prevent or punish it. Therefore Resolved, That the Governor be and he herby is requested to write to the Legislature of the State of ever Hampshine on this Subject, that the necessary measures may be taken fif none wuch are already adopted to provent the exportation of Mastr, yards and Span from faid Sent up for Concurrence Caleb Davis, Speaker.
