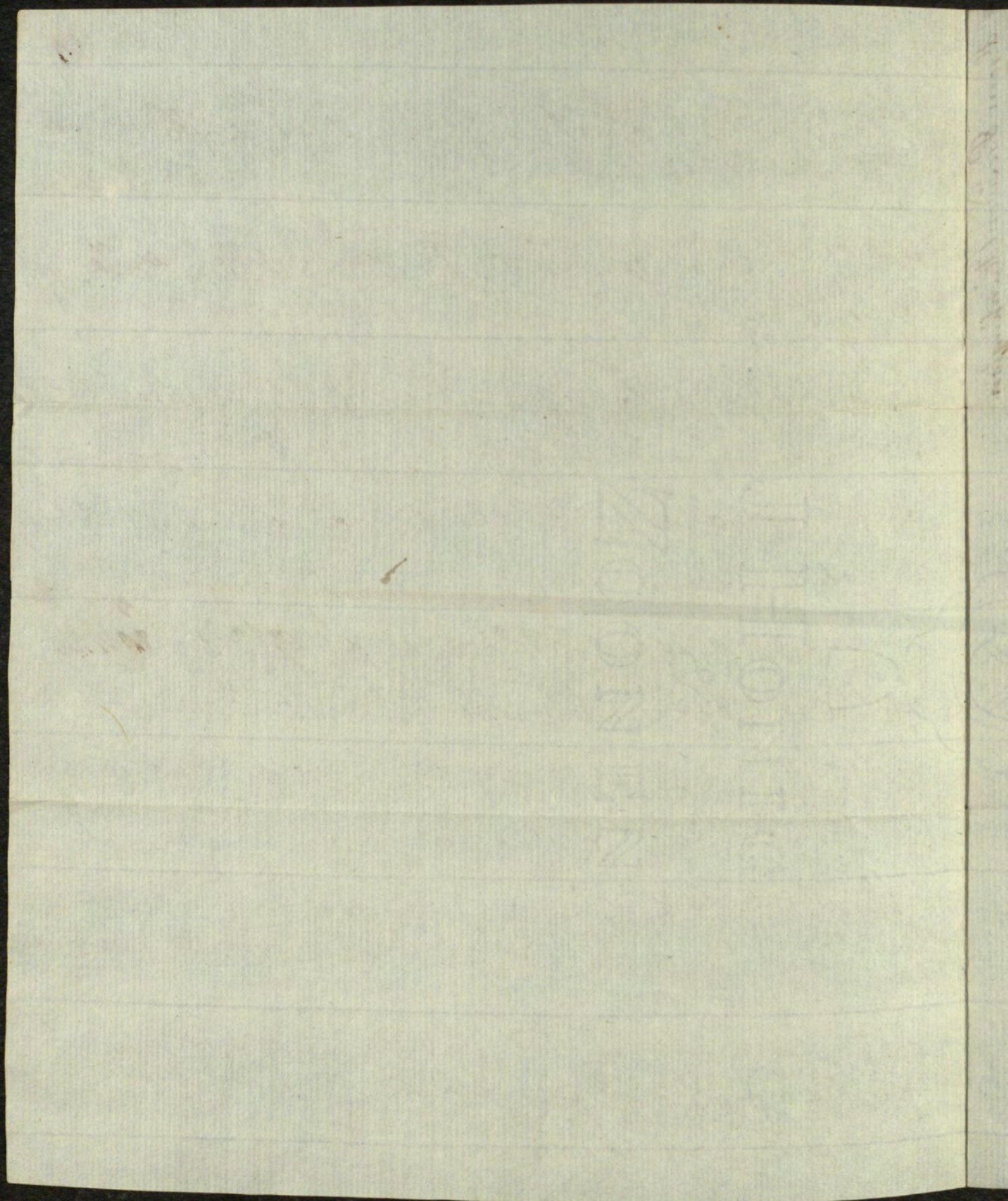
Sir,
