May 11th

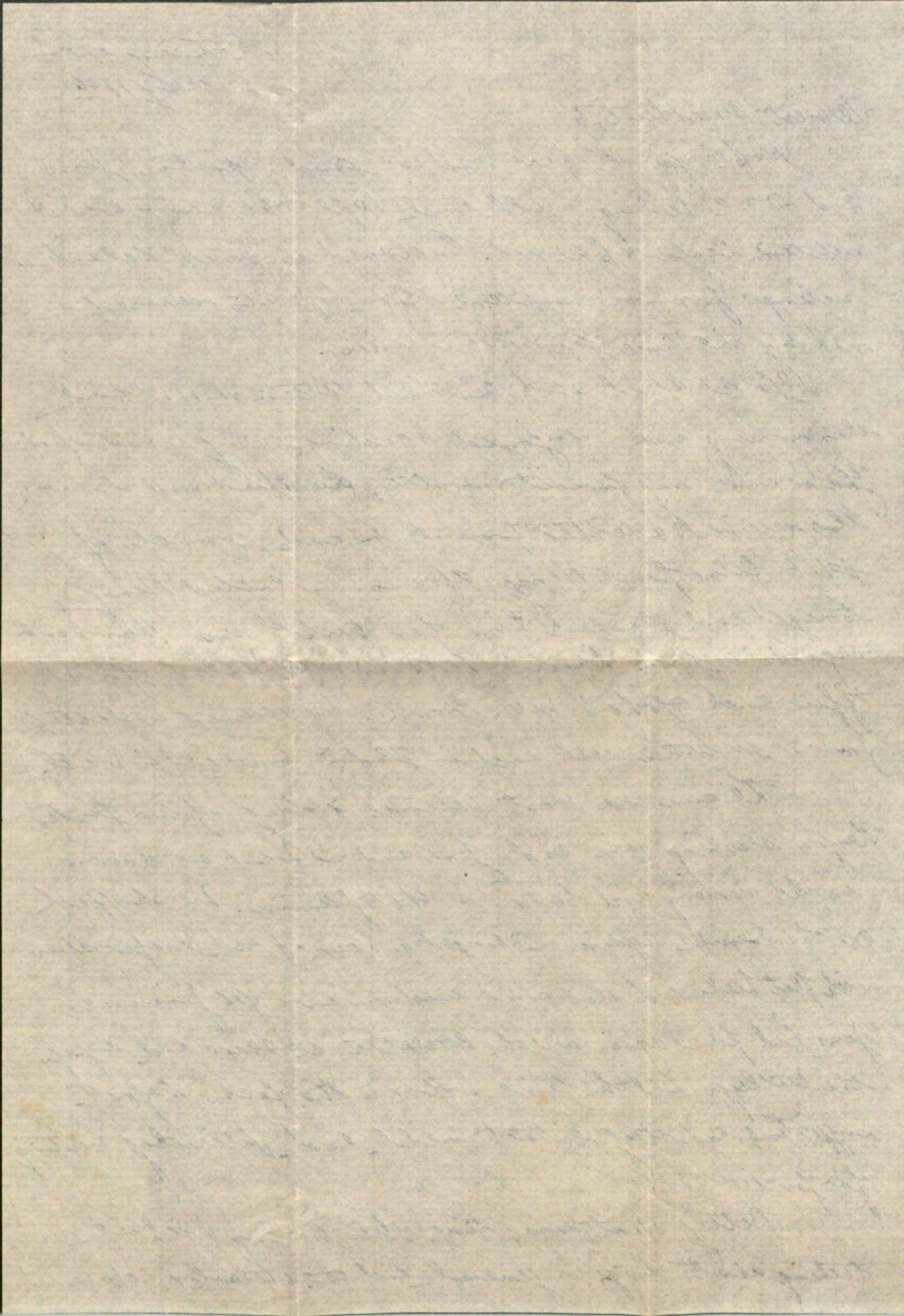
Dearest Sweetheart,

Shall I send these 2 rolls of 116 to you? Let me know at once. Is it O.K. to send more parcels? Did you receive the camera and sweater yet? Is there a chance of you ever getting out of the army? That's all for the question box.

Last night I wrote you a v. mail letter. I wrote about the lovely basket of fruit and goodies Billy sent me for Mother's Day gift. It was tremendous and I really believe he's Santa Claus. During the day he called me and sends his best wishes to you. Heidi Bell called yesterday and all is well with her. We'll see each other soon.

War news in Japan is encouraging and peace offers are being made but not accepted. Who knows, maybe that phase will end soon too?

I still love you with all my heart think of you constantly and dream of you and Jim and me together again soon.
