Wednesday - Dec. 29th 1943.

George, my darling,

It's six weeks since I've seen you last and it almost seems as though it's still all a dream. But I'm sure to wake up one of these fine days and find you in my arms where you belong. All last night I kept dreaming of you, my dearest, and in the morning little Sunny Jim was there to remind me of our love for each other. He's so like you in looks that I actually see you reflected every time I gaze upon that sweet face of his. As you know that the excitement of your call and the reception made me overlook the fact that Jimmie was 15 months old on Sunday! We're slipping, Daddy. Hope you're well, dear, no news since Sat.

In yesterday's letter I didn't mention too much because it was written in a few moments. Betty had an important dinner engagement with Ben and I offered to take care of Lawrence. He's usually good with me but last night he may have been upset in his new surroundings and vomited on one of our kitchen chairs. Poor Jimmie started to cry while watching Lawrence and

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my stomach was "blitzkreiged". Quickly I cleaned up the mess
changed him completely and satisfied him with a cookie which he
didn't eat. Soon after both babies were put to sleep, Jimmie
in his crib and Lawrence on your bed. Then your Mom and
Pop came in and soon after a friend of Ben's with some
parts for the vacuum which I ordered. Did I mention it to
you recently? The set of parts are \$8.50, including a brush which
the vacuum didn't have and it's sure going to be a great help
in the housecleaning. The man "Herman" said our vacuum is worth
\$40.00 and is still good for 10 more years.

Later in the eve after the folks left, I finished off
a few letters, listened to Hope and Shelton and then Ben and
Betty came in to call for their little one. He was fine in
the morning and later in the day, to-day, I told Betty about
what happened and not to worry, kids are like that.

Herbert Kenken called last night, hasn't been to his
office yet and the baby was in with a cold for the past 2 wks.
Mildred is fine and we'll visit them soon, maybe in 3 wks.
Danny and Mr. Pinus called to-day, they both wrote you
long letters and send their best wishes. Mr. Pinus's son
was married about 2 weeks ago. My folks called this morn'g.

No mail from you this week as yet. Maybe the aft. mail.
Baby and I are fine and we're both resting - Jim is napping.
All my love to you and a Happy New Year. As always
Florence

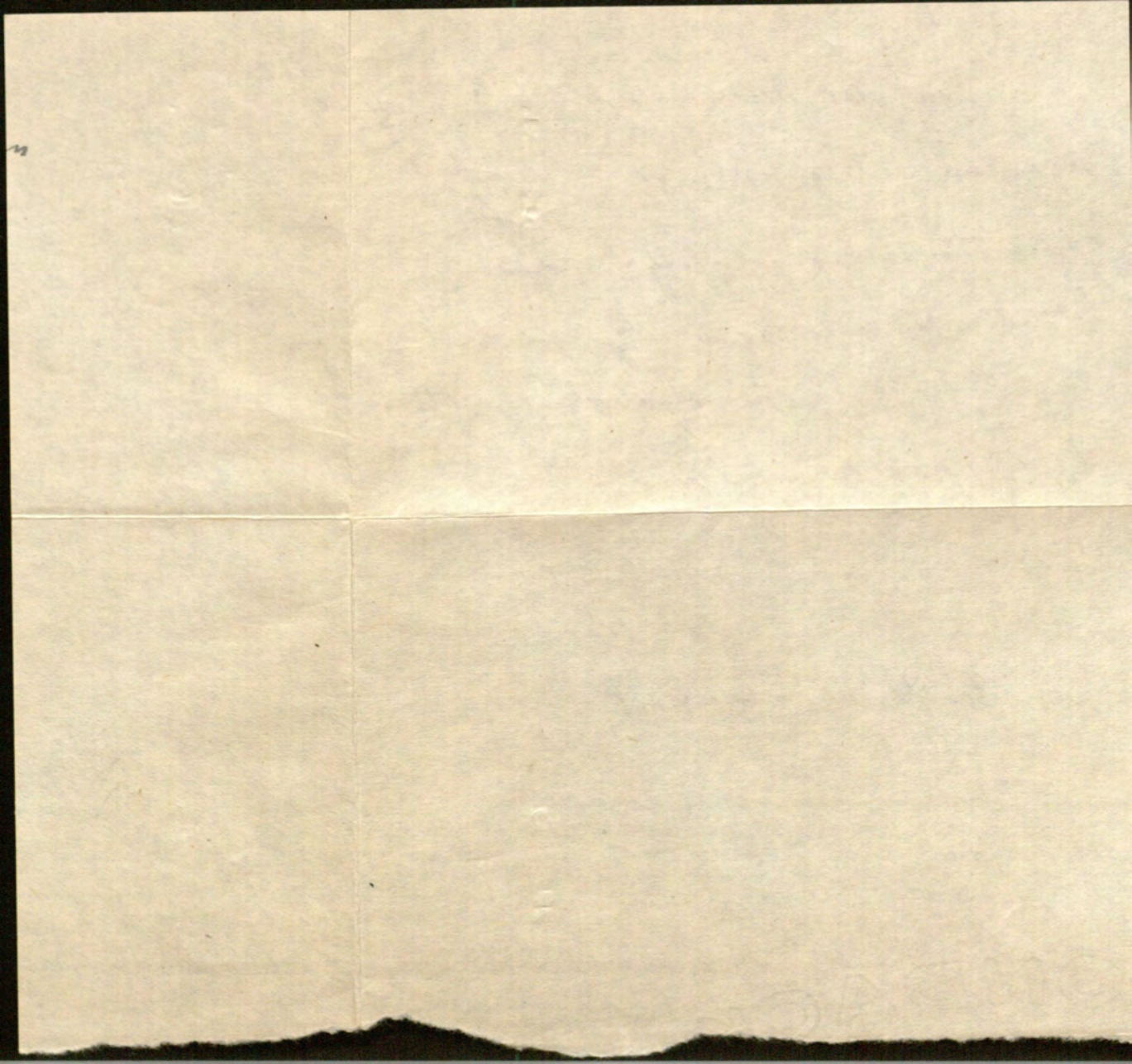
P.S. Just got your Sunday letter with

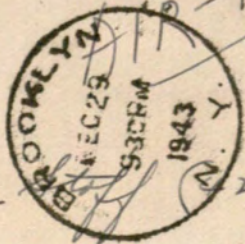
