Dear Friends at Home:

I sent you
No. 1 last Monday ^{much} & also received your
first No. 1, written Mar. 30th, on the same
day. Last Friday I received your two
letters dated Mar. 14th & 25 and last
Saturday I received No. 1 dated April 11th
& 13th. So you see at last I have got
to receiving letters again in good
earnest so I am going to writing letters
again I have the materials now for
writing, never mind about sending me
more paper in your letters. I hope you
have received the \$20.00 I sent to Father
last Friday what did you have to pay
for expressage? I had no idea it would
cost what the expressman said \$1.25

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Dear Friends at Home:

I sent you No. 1 last Monday week & also received your first No 1, written Mar. 30th, on the same day. Last Friday I received your two letters dated Mar. 14th & 25 and last Saturday I received No 1 dated April 11th & 13th. So you see at last I have got to receiving letters again in good earnest so I am going to writing letters again I have the materials now for writing, never mind about sending me more paper in your letters. I hope you have received the \$26,00 I sent to Father last Friday what did you have to pay for expressage? I had no idea It would cost what the expressman said \$1.25

However I had but little faith in the mails at that time & was afraid to risk it. Has Father paid George Harrar for express on my ~~debt~~ to N.? if he has not I wish he would.

I got some photographs taken a few days ago. ~~I enclose one if you do not receive it, ^{all right} please write to James for one, I shall send him three.~~

They don't cost much here \$4.00 pr. doz. ^{very} ^{awful} ^{high} ^{every} ^{thing} is I find a dollar don't go far now I hope Congress will raise our pay it is altogether too small at the present time.

Can you all heard of the terrible massacre at Fort Pillow it is horrible to think of the rebels are everywhere showing signs of weakness & demoralization. I really believe the present year will close up this war. Their desperate acts show signs of weakness. Every deserter which comes into our ^{lines} of which we saw hundreds in Tenn. all tell the same story of want

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& destitution which prevails among them. They seem to be wanting in most everything but daring, bravery, & cruelty. Our Corps is fast being organized and troops are daily arriving yesterday the Maryland Brigade of colored troops marched by camp on their way to camp they made a very good appearance headed by a full negro band which played finely. I understood that the 3d Division of our Corps is to be composed entirely of colored troops & Gen. Edward Greener is to command it he was our old General. I am surprised to see with what perfect satisfaction colored troops are looked upon by the whites, the old prejudice against negroes & negro troops has all died away. Now every soldier says he is glad to see negro troops & thinks they will fight well of course there are some exceptions some don't like negro equality. but most of them were saying

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man's life has been saved. The copper-
heads here as in N.Y. don't like to see
negro troops & they don't want us about
negroes being put on an equal footing
with us. We tell them we care nothing
about the equality a negro's life is no
better than a white man's.

From your letter of March 25th I learn
that you have received the allotments
up to Sept 1st 1863. We were paid off last
Dec. at Lee Springs for the months of Sept
& Oct. I should have thought you would
have got that allotment before this.
Now again we have been paid of for
the next 4 months a few days ago.

The amounts are all correct so far as you
have received it I send you an envelope
directed as I would like to have you
direct yours in future I send you this so
you can see the form & what is necessary
to put on your letters there is no need
of putting on Burnside's Command as
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for evry negrow that is shot a white man's life had been saved. The copperheads here as in NH don't like to see negrow troops & they taunt us about niggers being put on an equal footing with us. We tell them we care nothing about the equality a negrows life is no better than a white mans.

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
