March 29th, 1944.

George, my love,

All's well in your royal household
and baby and I are just fine. My
Aunt Mildred slept here overnight and
was no trouble at all. She's going to
watch baby a few afternoons so that I
can do some shopping in the city. That
will be a break for me and probably
my first shopping tour since you left.

Spoke to your mom earlier in the
evening and the folks are O.K. but had
no mail from you or Bob to-day.

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In fact, I received no mail from
You or anyone else. It may be
due to the censorship and maybe the
nasty weather. We were indoors
all day and found plenty to keep
ourselves occupied. Baby is cuter than
ever and goes through his paces
daily (his eyes, ears, nose, etc.) but his vocab-
ulary is so limited. Mommy and I
had a swell time this afternoon rolling
on the living room rug and ducking
every time Jimmie made an attempt
to stroke me. He's quite strong.

Very few calls to-day - just the
 folks and Jills Liebers. Jell has gland
 trouble again, due ^{to} a cold so I guess Min
 has her hands full. My mom is finishing
 up a fine wool bathrobe for Jimmie
 and he'll look like a little "thick" in it.

The reason we changed our minds about
 going to the nuts (next Sun) was because of
 the Easter holidays and Friday is better
 for Eleanor. It will be quite a mix-up
 if Bess is having his folks up then but
 I'll keep you informed about any more
 changes, if any. Will write to Bess
 to-night about our new plans.

Just spoke to Sunny who's feeling lots
better and sends her best regards to
you. She gave her sterilizer to some friend
who never returned it so I told her I'd
lend her ours. Lots of their friends are in 1A
and Addie expects his 1A when the baby
is born. They're all going in thick and fast.

Hope that you're well and that I get
some fine news from you to-morrow.
Did you get that medal for shooting?

My heart is just full of joy thinking
that we may be together again within 2 or
3 weeks. I sure love you, darling, and can't
wait patiently for the day that I'll see
