George, sweetheart,

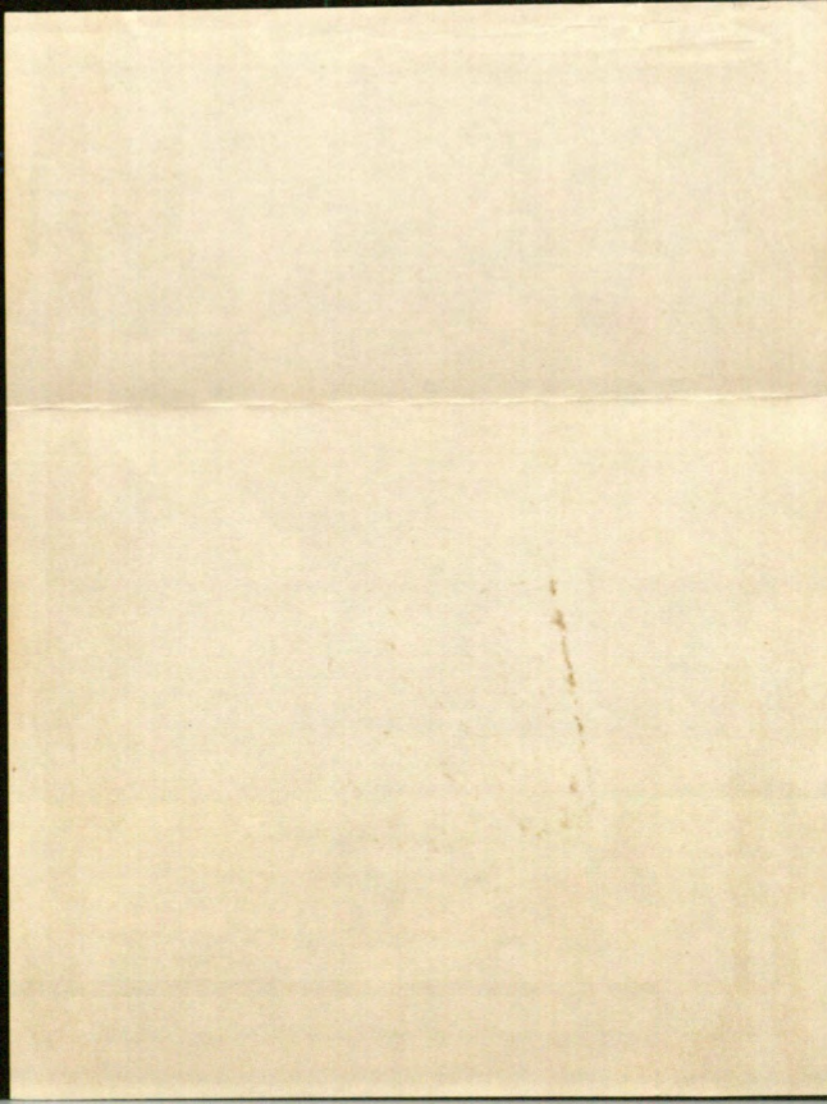
