I don't know what to say now; it's all in the hands of the fates. Fran has a swell job, I mean it's really good, and she looks better all the time. I bet she's gained over 10 pounds since she got here. I rather hope I'm held back a few weeks, if nothing else.

All is well. Doing fine in my studies, and feel pretty confident of my ability to get through this; wish I knew where I stood. Well, nothing else of

import to write about, so hoping you're doing well, and feeling well. —
