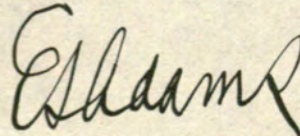
Receipt is acknowledged of your recent letter volunteering your services to the War Department. Please fill out the enclosed questionnaire as completely as possible and return in the envelope provided.

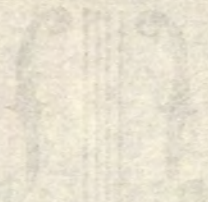
